History

Back in 2011 Liz O'Neill, CEO & Artistic Director of Z-arts commissioned some research to find out how many other venues in the region were already programming children's theatre, or who wanted to do more. There were a number of venues who all said the same thing:

"We'd love to be able to bring more great children's theatre to our audiences, but we need support to make it happen".

When asked if they were interested in forming a network to help realise those dreams, she was inundated! The whole idea of working together was that we could support each other, not only in identifying high quality children's theatre, but also in bringing down the costs of touring for the companies themselves and keeping tickets affordable for families.

We knew that, together, we could create 'mini-tours', reduce costs and pass those savings onto audiences. We secured Arts Council funding in September to create a two-year touring programme across the original 15 venues.

Big Imaginations has been supported by Arts Council England ever since, initially through two consecutive Strategic Touring bids, and then embedded into Z-arts National Portfolio funding.

Artist Imagination Fund

In 2020 we started the Artist Imagination Fund, a fund that is open to all artists and companies developing or creating performance for children and families and based or working in the Big Imaginations member areas.

So far we have allocated 23 pots of money, between £1k and £5k, to support 36 lead artists. Alongside the funding, artists were offered training and development opportunities and support from their host Big Imaginations organisation. Which could include access to space, advice on funding applications and mentoring.

The most significant impact has to have been gaining the confidence to programme theatre shows. It was like being in a vacuum trying to figure it out alone but since joining the Big Imaginations network it really helped! Especially as it's a network of likeminded people.

The support is invaluable.

Before the network, I was programming in the dark, doing google searches and hoping for the best. I had no idea about quality, no idea about good family theatre and no idea about accessibility or accessible performances.

The BIG network has blown my mind

about non-traditional theatre and what's possible. It's broken-down barriers for myself and our community, it's been transformative! It's allowed us to take a leap, and get quality shows, without taking a gamble.

I've not got time to watch loads of shows so everyone in the network catching a show here and there means there's chance to see the theatre out there and a lot of people in the network have their fingers on the pulse of what's good and current!
